The Partnership Forums in Bolton aim to strengthen school governance by providing information about local and national initiatives and changes in government legislation. The forums help support effective communication between governance boards and the local authority and promote cohesive working within the Bolton family of schools. The forums are organised and facilitated by the Governance Services Team, with a strategic lead from within the Education, Learning & Inclusion Team.

The meetings are held on a termly basis and the membership is based on attendance of one governor per primary school or academy – the ‘partnership governor’. If the partnership governor is unable to attend any of the meetings, a substitute governor may attend in their place. Attendance is free of charge for all Bolton schools and academies.
